Education @ ACN

- 18 graduate certificate courses that are accredited by the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency (TEQSA) delivered at AQF level 8.
- Graduate certificate course consists of four units of study which are studied over a ten week term (15 hrs study per week).
- 69 single units of study that students can study as part of a graduate certificate course or as stand alone units.
- Articulation agreement with the University of Canberra (UoC) to recognise our graduate certificate courses as advanced standing in their Masters program.

General information

- Two intakes each year; January and July
- Four terms each year; January, April, July and October. Each term is ten weeks in duration
- Students have three years from time of enrolment to complete the course
- FEE-HELP is available for Australian citizens
- Students do not pay 'up front' for the entire course and fees are paid per unit of study before each term commences
- ACN members are entitled to a 10% discount for each unit of study
- A graduation ceremony is held each year as part of our National Nursing Forum.

Entry requirements

- All applicants seeking admission are required to:
- hold a Bachelor of Nursing or registered nurse* equivalent qualification
- be currently registered with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA) or the equivalent registering authority in their country of origin
- have a minimum of one year postgraduate experience
- Single unit of study may be applicable to enrolled nurses.
